## Gupapuyŋu Godu-Mayali'mirri Dhäruk ga Dhäwu Mala

## liya (head)

<u>liya-wandirri</u> head + run thoughts run away (verb)

Yolnu ga liya-wandirri manikay.

Her thoughts are taken away in songline.

Yolnu nayi ga nhina, nhäma nayi dhu ga gumurr wäna nula nhäkurru garrwarlili wo noylili gumurr wäna nhäma. Bala nayi dhu nunhi wata dhu ga biw'yun, buma nanya dhu ga rumbal watay bala nayi dhu guyanana nayi dhu yolnunha mala nunhi näthili walala bäynudhina, gunharra'yurruna nanya gurrutumirriy yolnuy mala. Bala nayi dhu dhunupana milkarrimirriyirri nhannu dhu rumbal bala nayi dhu ga liyawandirrina manikayna dar'taryun nayi dhu ga. Liya-wandi'wandirri, guyanana nayi dhu ga nhä mala nunhi maln'thurruna näthili nhanukala walnanura.

A woman is sitting and looking around her country from above and underneath. Then the wind blows. She feels the wind blowing towards her from the north, east, west, or south. Then she starts thinking about people who passed away and left her behind a long time ago. Her body then starts becoming emotional and she feels like crying. She starts singing and crying. In doing so, her **thoughts are running away** to what happened to her life and thoughts of her kin who passed away.



## bun'kumu (knee)

bun'kumu-diku knee + raw disrespectful (adjective)

Bun'kum-diku dhuwala yolnu, nayi dhu marrtji nhanukala djälyu nula yolkala. This person is disrespectful and goes to people whenever she wants.

Bun'kumunydja dhuwala yäku limurru dhu <u>l</u>akarama ŋunhi ŋayi dhu ga yolŋu marrtji yolkala wäŋalili nhokala djälyu ga yanaka nhe dhu rum'rumdhun bun'kum-rum'rumdhun nhe dhu bäyŋuna bili ŋunhiyindja nhe bun'kumu-dikuna. Nhokalana djälyu nhe dhu marrtji ga walalanydja dhu yolŋunydja nhuna nhäma ga yätjkurruna nhunana <u>l</u>akarama bili nhe marrtjina dhunupa yäna bunana walalangu. Yakana nhe rum'rumdhuna walalangu.

Bun'kumu (kneecap) is the term that we use when you visit someone's place whenever you want and don't behave respectfully because you have **lack of respect**. You go to someone's place whenever you want and the people staying or living there watch and criticise you because you visit them without notifying them in advance. You are not respecting them.



## <u>l</u>uku (foot)

luku-nhirrpan
foot + put

place (verb)

Walala yolnuy <u>l</u>uku-nhirrpara yothunha märr nayi dhu ga nhina nunhili bili wänanura. They placed a child so that she stays just there.

Näthili walala li yolnunha mala luku-nhirrpan nurukiy wänawa märr ga walala dhu ga djäga ga walalanydja dhu marrtjina wiripunydja wäna-watanunydja mala nula nhäkurruna wakirlili wo maku wiripulili wänalili. Marrtji walala dhu yaka gupa-dälnydja yurru yalalanumirriy walala dhu ronjiyirri ga nunhinydja walala dhu nhirrpana yolnu'yulnunha, "Ma' nhuma gi djäga dhiyala limurrungu wänawa" nhakuna luku-nhirrpana walalanha. Djäga walala dhu ga wänawa manapan ga nhina. Ga walalanydja dhu nunhi marrtjina gunharra'yurruna walalanha wänawatanunydja mala yolnu'yulnu. Ga nhirrpana wiripununha gurrutu'mirrinunha mala märr ga walala dhu ga djäga.

Once the traditional owners **assigned someone to remain in place**, so that they would look after that place. The traditional owners would go somewhere else, such as hunting and gathering, to some other country. Not forever, however, sometime later on they come back and assign a group of people "OK, you mob look after our land here." This is how people are assigned to remain in place. They look after the place together and live there. The traditional owners of the place left them behind. They **assigned kin to stay in one place** so they look after that place on behalf of the traditional owners.
